



This segment gets your students thinking about the lesson concept.

GARBLED SPEECH

Ask two volunteers to come to the front of the class. Give each volunteer six saltine crackers. You should stuff your mouths with the crackers or simply try to talk while clenching your teeth together. When your mouths are full, you will try to state some information from each of these:

- · National anthem
- · Lyrics to your favorite song
- · A poem or a Bible verse

? How difficult is it to understand someone whose message is garbled by a mouthful of crackers or through clenched teeth? (It's not easy to understand, because they can't communicate very well.)

Today's lesson is about three speaking gifts God gives Spirit-filled Christians-prophecy, speaking in tongues, and interpretation of tongues.

Learning God's Word This segment present with the Bible lesson.

THE SPEAKING GIFTS

1 Corintbians 12:4-11; 14:3-13,22,24-31

? Have you ever heard someone give a prophecy, a message in tongues, or an interpretation? What did you think about it? Allow students to share their impressions freely.

AGREE/DISAGREE How do we know if a

gift of prophecy is from God? If it is a message from God, it will be in agreement with the Bible Read the following statements. Have the students turn to the right if the statement is in agreement with the Bible and turn to the left if it is wrong and is not supported by the Bible.

- · God loves physically challenged people less than He loves others. (Disagree)
- · The Bible says Jesus will come again on October 5. (Disagree)
- · Jesus died for everyone's sin. (Agree)
- · There are only a few mistakes in the Bible. (Disagree, there are none)
- · The devil loves us. (Disagree)
- · Heaven is an incredible
- place. (Agree) · Everyone has sinned. (Agree)
- · Lifting hands, kneeling, and singing are three ways to worship. (Agree)
- · Only adults can receive spiritual gifts. (Disagree)
- · God speaks to His people through prophecy. (Agree)



An opening activity gets your kids interacting with each other, and can help break the ice (especially for newcomers), and get them thinking about the lesson.

Numbers referenced here refer to the question numbers from the **Bible** Fact-Pak, an incredibly effective Bible memorization tool. These questions correlate with the lessons. (See page 13 for more information.)

Spiritual Gifts

First Corintbians 12:1 says, "Now about spiritual gifts, brothers, 1 do not want you to be ignorant."

- A spiritual gift is a special ability, given by the Holy Spirit as He wills, to be used to minister to others and therefore build up the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12.7)
- Only believers bave spiritual gifts (1 Corintbians 2:14).

I'm learning Spanish at school, and I love it! In fact, maybe I'll become a teacher or missionary when I grow up.

Anyway, Mr. Hunter brought in this guy who

speaks Spanish to help explain how the gift of interpretation of tongues works, and guess who got to be his interpreter for the class!

I always thought spiritual gifts were hard to understand, not to mention a little scary. But now I get it—it's just another way for God to speak to us. And I want to hear what He says!

Give each student a sheet of paper and write the following questions on the board. Ask volunteers to read the lesson on page 1 of the **student guide**. Have the rest of the class listen for the answers to the following questions and write them on their papers.

- 1. What is the gift of prophecy? (Message from God given through the Holy Spirit to a person for the church or individual)
- 2. What is the gift of tongues? (The Spirit enables a believer to speak in a language the person has not learned.)
- What is the gift of interpretation of tongues? (The ability given by the Holy Spirit to present, in a language all can understand, the meaning of a message spoken in tongues)

The student guide reads as follows:

- God gives speaking gifts to Spirit-filled believers. They are the gift of prophecy, the gift of tongues, and the gift of interpretation.
- Prophecy is a message from God given through the Holy Spirit to a believer for the church or individual. Usually, it is not a prediction of future events but a message to God's people, encouraging holy living, faithfulness, and staying true to God (1 Corinthians 12:10; 14:3,24,25,31).
- Speaking in tongues is primarily used in a group worship service. A Spirit-filled believer will speak in an unknown language, delivering a message to the church body. The use of the gift of tongues in this way will let believers know that God has a message for them and will show that God is present (1 Corinthians 14:26–28).
- Speaking in tongues can also be used by the believer in his or her time of personal devotions. In this instance, the person speaking in tongues is closely "tuned in" to the mind of the Spirit as he prays, gives thanks, or even sings in the Spirit.
- Interpretation is the ability given by the Holy Spirit to present, in a language all understand, the meaning of a message spoken in tongues (1 Corinthians 12:10).

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 If there is a message in tongues, Christians should pray to receive the interpretation so the entire congregation can understand and be encouraged and strengthened in God (1 Corinthians 14:6-13).

Read or summarize the information from the sidebar to give examples of what the Bible says about spiritual gifts. Have the students complete pages 2 and 3 of the **student guide** to review the lesson. (Answers: "The Gift of Prophecy"—A message from God given through the Holy Spirit to a person for the church or individual; "The Gift of Tongues"—The gift of tongues is to help helievers, nonbelievers, in private prayer, in group worship, in leading others to Christ, by encouraging helievers; "The Gift of Interpretation"—(A) The Lord is my friend; (B) I am the Lord your God; (C) The Lord your God is with you; (D) The earth is the Lord's.)

Teacher Tip

Invite the pastor to your class to belp explain the speaking gifts to the students and answer any questions they may have.

Activities that keep students moving will involve those who learn by moving and touching, plus reinforce the lesson for other students.

Another way to help students understand the importance of 'interpretation of tongues' is to invite someone who speaks another language to class. Or you may use a recording of someone speaking a foreign language (such as a movie. CD, or book). If any of your students speak another language, be sure to use a language that is not familiar to them. Let the students listen to the person speak in another language for a moment.

- ? What did you hear?
- ? Why couldn't you understand what the person
- was saying? (It was another language.) Just as an interpreter is needed to translate the meaning of what we have heard today, the gift of interpretation of tongues is needed in the church when a message in tongues is given.

Questions and statements are printed in bold and are followed by response hints and commentary that specifically address the issues being raised. Even if your students don't respond, asking the questions will get them thinking on a deeper level.

HELPFUL HINT: If you don't want to use the questions, simply turn them into statements and summarize the information that follows.

Whenever a *Preteen Resource* item is used in the lesson, a small picture of the item is included, so you know exactly what it looks like.

SAMPLE TEACHER GUIDE LESSON

Using activities from the **Student Guide** helps your students review the story and reinforces the lesson objective.

Preteen Problem sections give you a general topic or raise a specific issue to help your class connect the lesson with their own lives.

We intentionally include more options than you can use in a normal class period to ensure our Radiant Life PreTeen resources are adaptable for a wide variety of settings and learning styles.

MAKE IT WORK FOR YOU:

Before class read through the options and choose the ones best suited to your students, time constraints, and classroom setting. Remember, anything labeled "option" can be used or left out without impacting the lesson's effectiveness.

SPEAKING GIFTS IN ACTION

Relate how the speaking gifts positively affect our words to others by asking the students the following questions:

- ? Why do we need speaking gifts? (To show God's supernatural power; to let people know it is God speaking and not people; to encourage, to comfort, and to guide people)
- ? How can these gifts be used in everyday life? (When you don't know bow to pray for something, the Spirit can pray for you; speak in tongues when you pray; give a prophecy during Sunday School class if the Holy Spirit prompts you to do that.)
- ? How can these gifts positively affect others? (They can encourage others; comfort others; confirm something; guide oth-

Read the Preteen Problem in the sidebar, then ask the questions to

spark discussion. Note that words we speak, whether on our own or through the Spirit, can have a powerful effect on others.

WHICH SPEAKING GIFT?

Display Lesson 2 Poster to help the students review the speaking gifts. Read the scenarios and decide which speaking gift is described. You may lift the color-coded flaps to check your answers.

HOLY SPIRIT HELPS US

Write some things you find hard to pray about. Assure the students that no one else will see their papers. On the bottom of your papers write: "The Holy Spirit can pray through us."

We all need to seek the baptism in the Holy Spirit during our personal prayer times this week. We can ask the Spirit to help us pray for the needs in our lives and for others' needs according to God's will.

Refer to Copy Master 3 to see ways to help and encourage students

to seek the Baptism so God can give them spiritual gifts to help strengthen the Church.

CLOSING ACTIVITIES

MEMORY VERSE

Ask students to do "It's Greek to Me" on page 4 of the student guide. (The answer is the memory verse in KIV.)
