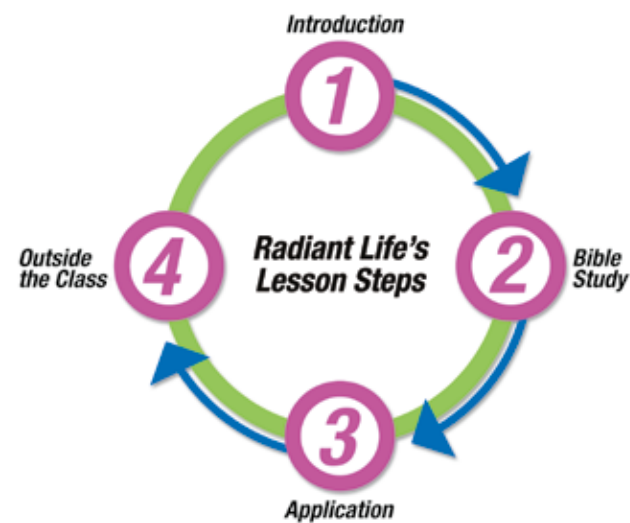

WHO YOU TEACH



SEEING

(visual)

Thomas likes to "see" his world. He enjoys colors, contrast, posters, illustrations, and videos, but gets bored when there are no visuals.



HEARING

(auditory)

Shay "hears" her world. She responds well to verbal interaction and enjoys being involved in discussion and debate, but becomes bored when she hears information she already knows.



TOUCHING

(tactual)

Noah likes to get in touch with his world. He needs to feel good about new concepts and learns best when he can manipulate objects with his hands.



MOVING

(kinesthetic)

Emma loves to experience her world. She moves a lot during class and enjoys participating in active illustrations like dramas and hands-on activities.

SAMPLE TEACHER GUIDE LESSON

Radiant Life Preschool lessons are easy to follow. Large, bold directives at the beginning of each segment actually walk you through the study at a glance. And our easy-to-follow format will help you keep your place while you teach the lesson.

* FRIENDSHIP; to encourage the child to be a friend.

Teacher Focus
Jesus said that the second most important command is to love others as we love ourselves. David and Jonathan were living examples of loving friends. Jonathan gave David his own princely clothing and weapons. While David hid in caves from Saul, he must have found strength in knowing that no matter what, Jonathan would always be his friend. Preschool children do not yet understand the sacrificial friendship that Jonathan showed David. But preschool children can begin learning about friends. At Sunday School children can hear the words *your friend*. "Carlos, please share some play dough with *your friend* Curtis." "In Sunday School you can share with *your friends*." "Karla, please show *your friend* Joel where to find the crayons. God is happy when you help your friends in Sunday School." Hearing such statements will draw young children's attention to ways they can act like friends.

Say the following lines.

Who is the FRIEND?
Let the children take turns guessing the friend you are describing. Help the child that guesses correctly repeat the lines and describe another child. Repeat the game until each child has been described. Then explain that today's Bible story is about two friends named Jonathan and David.

Help each child pair up with a friend. Then sing these words to the tune of "Skip to My Lou" while the pairs of friends skip to the worship area.

Help your students make the spiritual connection all the more quickly when they hear the story with **Time with God's Word**. Each one begins with a brief introductory activity that reflects the featured ideas behind the Bible story and thematically paves the way for the lesson.

Time With God's Word

Display a real or a paper crown. Talk about crowns.
 > What is this? Would you like to have a crown?
 > Who wears a crown?
 > Would you like to have a friend who is a (king, queen, prince, princess) and wears a crown? Why or why not?
 Next display a stuffed sheep. Talk about sheep.
 > What is this? Would you like to have a sheep?
 > Who takes care of sheep?
 > Would you like to have a friend that is a shepherd and takes care of sheep? Why or why not?
 Then hold an open Bible as you explain that today's Bible story is about a prince and a shepherd who were good friends.

Active Learning **BIBLE STORY**
 As you tell the Bible story, illustrate it with Preschool/BE Visuals. Suggested ways for the children to actively participate are provided.

Jonathan was a prince. (Display Preschool/BE Visual 10a with 10c positioned on top.) He lived in a palace. Jonathan's father wore a crown because he was the king. (Make a circle with your hands, and pretend to place crown on your head.)

David was a shepherd. (Add 10b.) Every morning David took the sheep to find nice, green grass. David led the sheep to cool, clear water to drink. David kept the sheep safe from wild lions and bears. Can you make a sound like David's sheep? *Baa-aaaa.* (Point to lamb in 10b. *Baa like a sheep.*)

David liked Jonathan. Jonathan liked David. Jonathan and David were best friends.

Sometimes David and Jonathan talked together in the palace. Sometimes David and Jonathan talked together in the fields or on the hillsides. Jonathan was always happy to see David, and David was always happy to see Jonathan.

One day Jonathan thought, *I love my friend David very much. I want to give him a special gift.* Jonathan thought about his beautiful robe the king had given him. (Stroke pretend robe.) He thought about his bow and arrow that he used for hunting. Jonathan thought about his special sword that kept him safe. (Position 10d near 10a.)

Jonathan knew what he would give David. Jonathan gave David his beautiful robe. (Position 10c over 10b.) Jonathan gave David his bow and arrow. Jonathan gave David his special sword. (Move 10d near 10b.)

"This is my promise," Jonathan said to David. "We will always be friends. We will love each other and be kind to each other." (Remove all figures. Add 10e. Encourage children to give someone a hug.)

Jonathan and David loved each other. God had given Jonathan and David a special friendship. Jonathan and David were glad that they were friends.

BIBLE STORY REVIEW

Let the children manipulate the Preschool/BE Visuals on the flannel board as they tell about their favorite part of today's Bible story.

Possible discussion questions:

- > What are the names of the two friends in the Bible story? (*Jonathan and David*)
- > Where did Jonathan live? (*in a palace*)
- > What work did David do? (*he was a shepherd*)
- > How did Jonathan show David that he was his friend and that he loved him? (*Jonathan gave David gifts of his robe, bow and arrow, and sword*)
- > Do you have friends you can do fun things with? (*answers will vary*)
- > Do you ever give your friends gifts? (*answers will vary*)
- > Who is your friend? (*answers will vary*)
- > What can you do with your friend? (*answers will vary, if needed provide suggestions such as: play games/ride bikes/teat cookies/go to the park*)

Active Learning HANDWORK

As each child colors her handwork sheet, encourage her to say, "Thank You, God for friends." Then instruct the children to draw a line from each item that Jonathan gave to David because they were friends. Next help them draw a line from each item that Micah and Collin can share because they are friends. Encourage each child that she can be a friend.

Active Learning BIBLE VERSE

Choose to teach a weekly Bible verse or to teach one verse throughout the unit. Begin the Bible Verse activity by reading the verse to the children from the Bible. Help the children repeat the verse several times.

Weekly Bible Verse:

A friend loveth at all times. Proverbs 17:17 (KJV)
A friend loves at all times. Proverbs 17:17 (NIV)

Duplicate, color, and cut out a boy and girl figure from Copy Master 2. Attach each figure to a craft stick. Hold up the boy puppet as you lead the boys in saying the Bible verse. Hold up the girl puppet as you lead the girls in saying the verse. (Keep puppets to use in Lesson 12.)

- > What are some things you can do to show love to a friend?

Duplicate, color, and cut out a boy and girl figure from Copy Master 2. Attach each figure to a craft stick. Hold up the boy puppet as you lead the boys in saying the Bible verse. Hold up the girl puppet as you lead the girls in saying the verse. (Keep puppets to use in Lesson 12.)

- > What are some ways that we can show that we love each other?



PRESCHOOL TEACHER GUIDE

Questions, key words, and statements are printed in bold and are followed by response hints and commentary that specifically address the issues being raised. Even if your students don't respond, asking the questions will get them thinking.

HELPFUL HINT: If you don't want to use the questions, simply turn them into statements and summarize the information that follows.

The **Bible Verse** focuses on using varied and interesting ways to reinforce the weekly Bible verse for all your students' learning styles. This is more effective than simple repetition.

Unit Bible Verses and **Weekly Bible Verses** are organized so that the big ideas of the unit become progressively clearer to your kids. **Unit Bible Verses** are reinforced by **Weekly Bible Verses** that contribute and further explore the general theme.

These activities develop character skills in your young students.

MAKE IT WORK FOR YOU: Before class read through the options and choose the ones best suited to your students, time constraints, and classroom setting. Remember, anything labeled "option" can be used or left out without impacting the lesson's effectiveness.

Actively Learning God's Word

Use one or more of the following active learning activities to review the lesson and provide life application emphasis. See page 92 for additional general activities.

Active Learning **GIFT FOR A FRIEND**
Let each child color a Copy Master 2 boy or girl picture and glue it to a heart shape. Let each child tell you the name of one of her friends. Print (Name) *is my friend* on the picture side of the heart. Print *Thank You, God, for friends* on the other side.

- > What were the names of the friends in the Bible story?
- > What gifts did Jonathan give to David?
- > What is the name of one of your friends?
- ♦ You can give this card to your friend as a gift and say, "God gives friends. I am glad that you are my friend."

Active Learning **MATCH THE FRIENDS**
Display the four scenes from the "Friends" poster. Give the numbered cards to four children. Help each child count the friends on his card and identify the number and color of his card. Then read the rhyme on each card and help the child match it with the appropriate scene. Emphasize the life application focus of each scene.

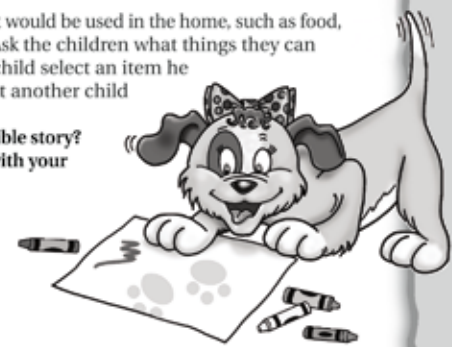

Active Learning **MISSING TOY**
Display and discuss five different toys. Ask the children to close their eyes. Place one of the toys in a gift bag. When the children open their eyes, ask them to guess the missing toy. When a child guesses correctly, let her remove the toy from the bag. Also let her choose the next toy to be placed in the bag.

- ♦ God gives us friends. Friends like to play together.
- > Can you guess what toy is in the bag?
- > How do you and your friends play with this toy?
- > When your friend has a birthday, what toy do you give her?
- > Can you say, "Thank You, God, for my friends"?

Active Learning **SHARING**
Display some things that would be used in the home, such as food, toys, a blanket, and soap. Ask the children what things they can share with their friends. Let one child select an item he can share with his friend. Then let another child participate.

- > Who were the friends in the Bible story?
- > Why is it important to share with your friends?

Life Application Illustrate this story with Preschool Bibletime Stories and the "Life Application" poster from the Resource Packet.

This is the story of how Marisa (Figure H) and Amber (Figure K) became FRIENDS.

Amber walked slowly through the door of the Sunday School classroom. She stopped just inside the door and watched the children. So, this is my new Sunday School, Amber thought. I wonder if I can find a FRIEND here.

Just then a big red ball rolled right by Amber's feet. "Hey, stop that ball!" Marisa called out. "Hi," Amber said picking up the ball. "May I play too?" "Sure, come on," Marisa said, grabbing Amber by the hand. "You can sit next to me."

Amber sat down in the circle next to Marisa and joined in the game the children were playing. (Show Preschool Bibletime Stories, page 2). The teacher asked each boy and girl to tell the name of a FRIEND, then roll the ball to that FRIEND.

Soon it was Amber's turn to roll the ball. "My FRIEND is Marisa," Amber said. When the game was finished, Amber asked, "What other fun things can we do in this Sunday School?" "Close your eyes and come with me," Marisa said, leading Amber to the craft table.

When Amber opened her eyes, she saw a big box of crayons. "Wow!" Amber exclaimed. "I love to color pictures. It's my favorite thing to do."

"Let's color a picture together," Marisa said. Marisa and Amber played games. They colored a picture. They listened to a Bible story. They sang songs about God. At the end of Sunday School Amber said to Marisa, "I am glad I came to Sunday School. And I'm glad God gave me a good FRIEND."

Active Learning **COMPLIMENTING FRIENDS**
Help the children sit in a circle. Put your hands on a child's shoulders and say, "What is one thing we like about our friend (Name)?" Possible answers might be: "She shares her toys. She has a nice smile. She gives big hugs. She is a helper." Then use the answers to sing a song to the tune of "Are You Sleeping?"

Jesus Chooses Special Helpers

(Matthew 4:18-22; 9:9; 10:2-4)

As Jesus was walking by the Sea of Galilee, He saw two brothers fishing. Their names were Peter and Andrew. Jesus called, "Come, follow Me." Peter and Andrew pulled in their nets, rowed to shore, climbed out of their boat, and followed Jesus.

As they were walking, they saw two more brothers fishing. Their names were James and John. When they saw Jesus, they pulled in their nets, rowed to shore, climbed out of their boats, and followed Jesus.

One day as Jesus and His new disciples walked along, they met Matthew sitting at a tax collector's booth. Jesus said to Matthew, "Come, follow me." Matthew stepped out of his tax booth and followed Jesus. Everywhere Jesus went, He called more men to follow Him. Seven more disciples followed Jesus. Their names were Philip, Bartholomew, Thomas, James, Thaddaeus, Simon, and Judas. Now Jesus had twelve disciples.

TOGETHER ACTIVITY
Ask your child how many men Jesus chose to be His helpers. Then count and name the 12 disciples with your child. Review the Bible story from page 1 and explain to your child that Jesus wants him to be His helper too. Ask him to draw his picture in the space provided next to the disciples by the number 13.
